HPE with Mrs Parkin

In 9-10 this term our focus has been on organising the Community Fun Day. The students have been writing letters for sponsorship to get prizes organised, writing letters to council to ensure we have the right equipment and busy organising the advertising and resources they require to create this community event to help increase health, wellbeing and participation of all ages in our local community.

Visual Art with Ms Christopher

Students have now completed the learning and experimentation phase of their spray painting unit. Each week, they have analysed and evaluated new spray painting techniques. I think we all found the night-time urban techniques a lot more difficult than imagined. Pattison and Caitlyn both seem to have mastered them, and the rest of us will get there when it counts, I'm sure! Students have now designed their own compositions to demonstrate all of their skills. In the first week of Term 2, they will produce one resolved artwork in response to the words: Unimaginable things seem imaginable at night when everyone is asleep. I can't wait to see them.

Math with Mr Carrello

Yr 9-10 math students ended with an exam in Algebra and most students to date have attained a satisfactory pass. Behaviour and effort by students has been generally very good but more effort is needed in maintaining student's concentration to the task at hand. Work in Term 2 will build on knowledge and skills obtained and revised in Algebra.

Science with Mr Carrello

In Yr 9-10 science, students completed their Climate Change research assignment in class and these assignments are currently being marked during Week 10. The student's attitude for learning has generally been good as has their general behaviour. Term 2, will at this stage, entail the class working on the chemistry unit of work.

Curriculum Corner: Year 11-12

Sport & Recreation with Mrs Parkin

Students have investigated the impact of sport and recreation on the community. After completing surveys they have collated, analysed, and evaluated the data and made recommendations for what the community would like to see as recreational activities in Winton.

Year 11 Biology with Mr Carrello

Significant progress continued to be made in the completion of the first unit of work entitled – 'Cells and Multicellular Organisms'. All theory relating to this unit of work is expected to be completed early in Term 2 after which a large proportion of Term 2 will be devoted to practical activities. This will enable students to be best prepared for the upcoming student practical experiment assessment planned for the middle of Term 2. Students have shown a strong willingness to learn and the classroom behaviour has been excellent.

The data test planned for Week 9 (Term 1) on the 24th of March was postponed and now scheduled for the end of Week 1 during Term 2.

Year 11 General Math with Mr Carrello

Work during the late part of term 1 mostly involved working on the 'Shape and Measurement' topic of Unit 1 in Year 11 general math and progress made was significant. All topics in Unit 1 are expected to be completed by mid to late Term 2 and will be followed by an exam. All students last week submitted their budgeting assignment which is the first assessment task (Problem Solving Modelling Task) in Year 11 general math. Marking has yet to be finalised but it appears all students attained a satisfactory result. Students have continued to show a strong willingness to learn and behaviour and effort has been excellent.

Chappy Chatter

Hi everyone,

I hope you've had a great week and are looking forward to the holidays! The wellbeing topic today is Positive Emotion or feeling good.

Feeling good means you are in your comfort zone and coping well. Unpleasant emotions means you have discomfort and perceiving a threat and acting to protect yourself.

Feeling good gives you endorphins and lets your brain work better, it allows room to think more deeply because you're not looking to stop the threat and helps you manage, cope and make better choices.

So how do we do this when we know that humans have a negativity bias? Dr Fredrickson and Dr Hanson from PERMA plus suggest that we notice pleasant emotions when they occur and name them. Offset negative emotions with 3 positive ones. We can absorb these feelings into our consciousness and teach our brains that after a negative emotion, comes 3 positive ones. Have the experience and savour the positivity.

Some practical things to bring about positive emotions

- Compliment someone
- Give yourself a gift
- Have coffee and a chat with a friend
- Ask someone for a hug
- Remember a time that you had fun or you helped someone
- Move: go for a walk, or a swim
- Listen to a song or a movie that you like
- Sit in your garden/do some gardening
- Read a book
- Do some art or craft
- Visit a museum
- Do a puzzle/play a boardgame
