Students in grade 3 and up will be participating in wet activities on Friday afternoon, during the last day of school. Please make sure to pack an outfit that they can get wet in!




























# **Curriculum Corner Years 7-8**

For Transition Day, the 7-10 students created their own wall plaques/nameplates. They used different techniques such as wood burning, carving, routing, and the rotary tool.






